NEWS FROM WASHINGTON

AGENCIES SHOULD WEIGH GHG EMISSIONS IN NEPA REVIEWS.

The White House Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) announced on February 18 that it is proposing a number of steps to modernize and reinvigorate the National Environmental Policy Act

(NEPA), including the consideration of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and climate change impacts when evaluating proposed projects and actions. NEPA provides the framework for nearly all environmental reviews performed by federal agencies, and it applies to federal projects and actions, projects located on federal lands, and projects over which the federal government has jurisdiction. The CEQ's draft guidance proposes that any project resulting in GHG emissions equivalent to 25,000 metric tons of carbon dioxide or more per year should undergo a quantitative analysis of its environmental impacts. Specifically, agencies should consider potential measure or reasonable alternatives to reduce GHG emissions. The guidance also instructs agencies how to assess the effects of climate change on their proposed actions. The draft guidance does not apply to land and resource management actions.
